IN MEMORIAM William Mergard September 17, 1935 – June 15, 2009

Bill joined the National Model Railroad Association in 1971 and became a very active member in the LA Division and the PCR, and later in the PSR. He held most of the offices at the Region level and at the Division Level. He was also chairman of two national conventions, *Long Beach Limited 1996* and *Anaheim Special 2008*.

Bill was employed by Delta Airlines beginning in 1956. He also was very involved in the community as he and Irene raised their family. Scouting, Little League, and AYSO along with a love of trains were a major part of his life. He was also a member of the Southern California Garden Railway Society and put up an incredible annual Christmas display in his front yard that brought joy to many. In 1975 he became a part of Harold Graebner's First Friday of the Month Club where the group solved the world's problems and operated on Sigma Lines. Bob Rowe and Ken Wilson were among the original members. I joined the group in 1980 and felt quite privileged to be included.

Bill encouraged all of us in the hobby and was always very helpful. Affectionately known as "The King," he combined a serious side with an engaging sense of humor.

We will miss him.

As of this writing it is only a little over month until the PSR Convention here in Las Vegas. I hope you took my advice in the last Dispatch, started your contest entries then and are now finishing them up. I have been corresponding a lot with Bob Hamm, the National Contest Chairman. I tell you this for three reasons. The first is that he is very helpful and although we have not met in person, seems to be a real character-a glass half-full kind of guy. The second is that he has supplied me with a lot of input for the "So you Want to be a Judge" clinic that I am giving at the convention. As I mentioned previously, it will be open to anyone who wants to become a judge and anyone who wants to see how this judging business works, just so they can get better scores on their contest entries. The clinic is nearly developed and I think you will learn something from it. I intend to finish it next week in Chama, New Mexico at my annual work session with the Friends of the C&TS RR (just a small plug for a really worthwhile organization). This is my second year working on RPO 54. The neat thing about this car is that, when done, it can be used in the regular passenger trains because at its last D&RGW rebuilding (50 or so years ago) steel plates were added to the wood stringers in the frame so that it meets present day standards. But I digress. The third thing that Bob Hamm and I have been discussing is the Photo and Arts and Crafts part of the contests. He has changed the National standards so that these two categories are strictly popular vote contests. We may change to that format in the future. In fact, I would like your input about that. But, for the upcoming convention we will still use the judge's opinion as we have in the past. This has caused me a problem in that there are no longer National entry or judges scoring sheets for these categories. So, I have developed PSR forms for the Photo and Arts and Crafts categories. I will have plenty of them available in the contest room. Or, if you want to do them in advance, just e-mail me and I'll send them to you.
