

It's hard to believe that summer is right around the corner - but it is. Across our Region, we've already enjoyed some great model railroading activities and there are many

more to come. I'm very proud to serve as the president of one of the best Regions in the Association and that is due to our active and committed membership (that's you).

We held our Mid-Year PSR Board Meeting on March 23rd at Cajon's Temecula Meet (great event). Some of our meeting highlights included

- Nominations were announced for Board Director vacancies
- Recap from the 2012 Region Convention hosted by Los Angeles Division
- Update on the 2013 Region Convention hosted by Cajon Division in September
- Projections for the 2014 & 2015 Region Conventions
- Funds were approved to purchase the New NMRA banner for PSR

Here are the highlights from National's Mid-Year Meeting of the NMRA BOD (Atlanta - 02/08-10/13);

• CA State Railroad Museum Gallery Exhibit - The first interim goal of \$250,000 in pledges has been reached. This triggered a matching pledge of another \$250,000. Total estimated cost for the exhibit completion is \$750,000. It is estimated that more than 750,000 visitors will see this NMRA exhibit annually.

• 2016 NMRA National Convention – Indianapolis won

- 2016 NMRA National Convention Indianapolis won the bid for the 2016 national convention to be held July 3-10, 2016. Beginning in 2017, the Board approved a motion to allow more flexibility in scheduling national conventions. Current regulations require these conventions to be held between July 1 and August 15.
- Personnel Changes –
- o SER President Joe Gelmini has been appointed as Eastern Director for the remainder of the term due to John Roberts, HLM, MMR resignation for health reasons (John later passed away on March 1, 2013).
- o Our own Tom Draper, HLM, DSA has been appointed as Director of Support Services following the resignation of Gerry Leone, MMR. Tom will fill in until a permanent replacement can be found.
- o Rick Coble was confirmed as Assistant National

Secretary, supporting National Secretary John Stevens.

o At Large North America Director Miles Hale, MMR was charged with violating Article III, Section 22, Subpart b, Subparagraphs 2 and 4 of the Regulations pertaining to poor judgment and injurious actions affecting the NMRA. He has been removed from his position which is now vacant and pending replacement.

NMRA realized a positive return on the 2012 National Convention and Train Show. Reports will be posted on the website. The Executive Handbook has been modified to streamline financial procedures to ensure prudent fiscal management.

- Material Donations The Board approved a motion to enact policy to provide members an opportunity to purchase surplus, undesignated donation items donated to the NMRA.
- Communications The "NMRA eBulletin" was launched this month with the intent of keeping members informed of any breaking news, important dates, events and happenings in the NMRA.
- Marketing An aggressive marketing plan has been developed for the coming year to include online, brick & mortar hobby establishments, museums, targeted attractions, and select model railroad shows and conventions. Social media presence will also be seen on Pinterest, LinkedIn, Meetup, Facebook and Twitter. Work is also progressing on the Constant Contact email system, currently in the beta testing stage.
- HASEA Agreement A one year working agreement has been initiated to share NMRA standards and organizational knowledge with this organization.
- Strategic Planning A draft of the new plan will be presented at the summer Board meeting prior to the Atlanta National Convention. Major items will include streamlining the organization's vertical integration and simplifying the currently complex Executive Handbook.
- Professional Railroader Award The Board approved a motion to establish an annual award for those who have provided long term support and guidance to model railroaders on how the railroad industry works.

• Recognition – The President's Award was given to outgoing Atlantic District Director Nobby Clark and At-Large Director Worldwide Tony Koester, DSA, for their years of service to the NMRA.

Pacific Southwest Region, NMRA 2013 Mid-Year Board of Directors Meeting Report Saturday, March 03, 2013

Meeting was called to order by President, Don Fowler, at 1258 hours. Attending were President Don Fowler, Vice President Carl Heimberger, Treasurer Tom Draper, Vice President Carl Heimberger, Treasurer Tom Draper, Dir. AZ Div. Dave Irick, , Dir. Cajon Div. Bob Mitchell, Dir. LA Div Bob DeMoss, Dir. SD Div Gary Robinson, Membership Pete Steinmetz, Communications Ben Sevier, Contests Bill Jacobs, Achievement Don Stewart, Railettes Kim Fowler

Regular Business:

Minutes: The minutes of the March 2012 Mid-year Board of Directors meeting were presented. A motion was made by Carl Heimberger, and seconded, to approve the minutes as presented. There was no discussion and the motion was carried.

President's Report: President Don Fowler reported on the NMRA Mid-Year BOD meeting, highlighting those items that were relevant to the PSR. He noted the initiatives in marketing, communications and the involvement of the NMRA with the California State Railroad Museum as potentially having positive effects on the PSR and our members.

Vice President's Report: VP Carl Heimberger discussed membership issues, how to improve our image, and some ideas that all Divisions can use.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Tom Draper presented the status of the current year's finances. He reported that we are as expected according to the budget. He also reported that the Region's financial accounts and statements were audited by the audit committee, and no problems were found. A motion was made by Bob DeMoss, and seconded, to approve the Treasurer's Report. There was no discussion and the motion was carried.

Director's Reports:

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• Arizona Division: Director Dave Irick reported that the Arizona Division's membership has been holding steady, finances are good, and they continue to have a number of well attended Division events. Division elections are coming up, and he is encouraging members to participate by voting. He also reported that they are beginning work on the 2015 PSR Convention bid, assisted by the Scottsdate Model Railroad Historical Society. As part of his report, he brogut up questions about the convention date planning and location. A discussion was had of the venues being considered for the 2015 convention. A motion was made, and seconded, to approve the tentative date for the 2015 PSR convention dates, pending a formal presentation to the membership, and their vote of approval.

- Cajon Division: Director Bob Mitchell reported that the Cajon Division is financially sound, and is getting ready for the 2013 PSR Convention in San Bernadino. He passed on more details about the convention, and encouraged all to publicize the event in their Divisions.
- Los Angeles Division: Director Bob DeMoss reported on the activities of the Division, and their efforts to increase membership. Such events a Spring Rail (to be held in April) are proving good attractions for potential members. They are also preparing for their Annual Train Show at the South Coast Botanic Gardens, in October, and are planning increasing publicity for that event.
- San Diego Division: Director Gary Robinso reported a increased membership of 181, and strong financial health, with \$12,649.00 on hand. Preparations are underway for the 2014 PSR Convention to be held at the Marriot Courtyard on Hotel Circle in San Diego, beginning September 3, 2014. He also noted that a number of the local clubs are beginning to offer clinics that are being well received.

Standing Committee Reports

Membership: The Membership report was presented pro-tem by Tom Draper, in the absence of Debbie Draper. He reported that the current PSR membership stands at 1,174 members, a decline from last year and reflecting a continuing delince in region membership over the years.

Nominations: Nomination Chairman Tom Draper reported that the Division Director elections are this year. There is currently one candidate standing for each Division: Arizona Division – Dave Irick, Cajon Division – Per Harwe, Los Angeles Division – Robert De Moss, San Diego Division – Peter Steinmetz Railettes:: Railette Chair Kim Fowler presented her

report. Highlights included a discussion regarding possible extra fare status for such activities as classes, in part to pay for supplies, but more importantly, to facilitate planning. It was decided that a pilot program for this would be enacted at the 2014 convention in San Diego.

Historian: President, Don Fowler, encouraged the Board members to work at finding someone to fill this position.

Achievement Program: Don Stewart, AP Chairman, reported that 13 AP Certificates were arwared in 2012, one being that for MMR. He announced that Dave Irick has agreed to become Assistant AP Chairman. Contests: Contest Chairman Bill Jacobs discussed the changes ongoing in the contest program at the National level, and plans to mirror some of those in the PSR. Communications/Dispatch: Highlights, presented by Ben Sevier, included cost savings estimate for sending only balloting materials by USPS. He also encouraged everyone to join the regional and division "Yahoo" groups, to obtain information electronically. Ben also presented the idea of revisiting the possibility of a joint PSR/PCR convention. A motion was made by Dave Irick, and seconded, that Carl Heimberger start exploring the joint convention possibilities. Old Business

2012 Convention Review: 2012 Convention Chairman Carl Heimberger provided the final report on the results of the 2012 PSR Convention in Ventura, and presented \$342 to the PSR as the region's portion of the convention surplus.

2013 Convention Update: Bob Mitchell of the Cajon Division reported on the plans for the 2013 PSR Convention in San Bernadino in September, 2013. Member of the Year Awards:

It was moved by Dave Irick, and seconded, to budget \$600 for the same bells given as awards last year. There was no discussion. The motion was carried.

2014 PSR Convention: President, Don Fowler, reported

- San Diego Division will begin planning committee meetings in April 2013
- The 2014 PSR Convention venue has been confirmed
- There will be a swap meet on Saturday
- The Division is working with the San Diego Model Railroad Museum's new Director for events to be held at the Museum.

Adjournment:

The meeting was adjourned by President, Don Fowler, at 1605 hours. The next meeting will be on September 25, 2013 in San Bernadino, CA.

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
