## FROM THE WAYCAR

Siempre Avanti! (Loose translation: Always Forward)

This phrase has been my internal mantra for over a year now. Siempre Avanti! No matter what comes along, always move forward. Moving forward has not always been easy these days, but forward we must go!

Serving as the primary Chairman for the SurfLiner 2024 NMRA National Convention has presented a number of unique challenges, some very unexpected. At the end of this past January, we were notified by NMRA National that they were cancelling the contract with the Long Beach Convention Center, where the 2024 National Train Show was to be held. This was a financial decision on their part, but led to added burdens for the convention committee. The decision had to be made between having no National Train Show, or holding the train show at another venue. Since no other appropriate venue was available at this late date, the decision was made to hold the train show in the convention hotel. This resulted in a need to re-assign space usage in the hotel, and re-schedule or eliminate some planned aspects of the convention. This also caused a diversion of available convention planning time, which resulted in delays. We are currently working through these challenges, and we will still produce an outstanding National Convention.

So, long story short (too late!), there will be a National Train Show at the SurfLiner 2024. It will be a more intimate train show than has taken place at past conventions, but there is one great advantage: you won't have to leave the hotel to go to the train show! There will be layouts at the train show but, as a results of the reduced space, fewer layouts will be able to set up. Those that do will be smaller in footprint than they would have been otherwise. All of the other aspects that you have come to expect from a NMRA National Convention will be taking place at the SurfLiner 2024 National Convention.

Motor Coach tours are planned to take place Monday through Friday to layouts, prototype, and general interest destinations throughout Southern California. A full schedule of clinics will be offered, including eight Modeling With The Masters® hands-on clinics. The Celebration of Models (contest) room will have some of the most outstanding models on display-don't forget to bring your entry!

Our SIG (Special Interest Group) room will be hosting the OPSIG (operations), LDSIG (layout design), WIMRR (women in model railroading) SIG, and other railroad and historical SIG's. The OPSIG and LDSIG groups will be hosting their separate tours and dinner.

Our Non-Rail program, which we are preferring to call our Plus One program, will feature many activities not necessarily related to railroading. We are also going to continue the legacy of the Project Linus program. For those of you who are not familiar with this, Project Linus creates quilts and blankets at the convention which are later donated to children's hospitals and other deserving locations.

At this point I would like to remind our members in all Divisions of the Region that the SurfLiner 2024 NMRA National Convention incorporates the PSR Regional Convention. There will be no other Regional convention in 2024. We will be holding our PSR annual Board of Directors meeting as well as our PSR membership meeting at the SurfLiner 2024 convention. The PSR Member of the Year awards will be presented at the membership meeting, and I hope to see you there!

If all this sounds like a pitch for the SurfLiner 2024 convention, it is! It will be many years before the NMRA National Convention returns to California, and even more before it returns to Southern California, so I recommend you take advantage of this golden opportunity in the Golden State!

One more thing before I sign off: It takes a lot of people to produce a convention, particularly a National convention. Please remember to check the "volunteer" box when you register. We have many opportunities for volunteers, with varying time commitments, so don't feel you will "miss the convention" if you volunteer. Volunteering at a National convention also garners you the some of the highest Achievement Program volunteer points available. You will also receive a nifty safety vest featuring the convention logo that you can proudly wear and lets everyone know "I helped!"

SurfLiner 2024 NMRA National Convention

To finish off the year prior to the holidays, our monthly Zoom meeting for December included a scenery clinic by MMR Clark Kooning. Clark showed us how he makes and paints plaster rock moldings on his layout with various casting and coloring techniques. There were lots of great information in this clinic, and based on how good the pictures looked over Zoom, I'm sure the real thing on his layout looks fantastic.

With all of the end of the year holiday activities behind us, the Arizona Division has had an active first quarter. The Saturday Zoom meets for January and February were replaced with all day make-and-take clinics hosted by MMR's Clark Kooning and Peter Youngblood. The January clinic was scratch building a wood branch line coaling facility, and in February the clinic covered building a hydrocal structure kit. In March the topic was styrene kit-bashing a line side storage shed using a boxcar shell. I attend two of these, and you always learn something from these clinics even if it is a topic you are already familiar with.

Our spring in person meet on March 9<sup>th</sup> was held in the Phoenix area. Clinics included a "Bell Ringer" mini clinic series in the morning. This consisted of several mini clinics set up at tables in the meeting room, and members would rotate from table to table every 15-20 minutes at the ring of a bell. These quick clinics included topics on applying decals, introduction to the train simulator game Trainz, checking wheel and track with an NMRA gauge, weathering, and introduction to Arduinos. I enjoyed all of them and learned some new thing along the way. In the afternoon we had a clinic on Re-Making Your Layout. MMR Bob Ginger explained how he changed his railroad over the course of a few years from one that was not originally designed for operations to one that serves well for operations today.

Our quarterly sub-division meets continued in the Sonoran Sub-Division and the High Country Sub-Division with groups gathering for lunch and visiting a layout afterwards. The Sub-Division meets have also been started in the valley area and are anticipated to occur quarterly. The West Valley Sub-Division layout tour got a chance to visit MMR Bruce Petrarca's Rocky Mountain Pacific outdoor garden railroad in his back yard. One thing that really makes Bruce's railroad stand out from many of the other garden railroads I've seen are the backdrops painted on the fence. In the Phoenix area, most houses in developments have concrete slab fences around the back yards. They help to keep the blowing dust down (a VERY little), hopefully keep most of the snakes out, and they stand up to the hot sun. With mountain scenery painted on the fence, it really helps you get immersed into railroad just like on any indoor layout.

I want to congratulate our newest MMR in the Arizona Division, Jim Spice, MMR #759. I had the privilege of being on the evaluation team where Jim earned his last few certificates in early January. His Sn3 layout is something special, and if you ever have a chance to see it you will be impressed with his ability to capture the Rocky Mountain narrow gauge look.

On my own AP journey, I have constructed the benchwork for the peninsula on my layout over the last couple months. This part of the layout will have an engine terminal with a turntable and small roundhouse, along with a small yard. The area also will have a power plant, which will allow me to have a coal delivery location in addition to the diesel fuel, sand, and other materials required for engine servicing and maintenance. These features will cover some of the requirements for the Civil Engineer and Electrical Engineer Certifications. My intent with the design was to build the necessary components required for the AP program as well as have a layout that provided operating opportunities in the space I have available. Once I get the track laid on the peninsula and ensure it is all functional, I plan to build two small staging areas at each operation end of the layout. I will only have room for two tracks in each staging yard, but that will allow several other trains to be injected into the operating scheme. Then I can work on how the operations will be implemented, and on to working on the backdrop, facia, and scenery.

Hopefully you have registered to attend the Surfliner 2024 Convention this summer, but if you haven't, I encourage you to do so soon. It's only a few months away and you don't want to miss the great tours, layouts, clinics, or the National Train Show planned in August. I hope to see you all there!



I'm composing this column with fewer than two weeks left before the first quarter of 2024 becomes history. It's been a busy three months for the Los Angeles (L.A.) Division I'm pleased to report.

January started with the Division holding another of our quarterly local-area visitations. This time at Ron Varnell's 1,400 square feet *Union Pacific Railroad* – a highly detailed, smooth running layout which is a real pleasure to view and/ or operate. Better than seventy-five (75+) guests were hosted to a free lunch of hot dogs, chips, choice of drinks, and dessert; as well as great camaraderie.

**MEMBERS:** The San Diego Division of the National Model Railroad Association has 146 members.

#### ACTIVITIES OF THE SAN DIEGO DIVISION:

The San Diego Division holds activities every month. It also issues a quarterly newsletter, The Mail Hook, covering club activities, informative articles on railroading and model railroading layouts and modeling techniques.

**Summer Meet, August, 2023:** We had a swap meet and two clinic presentations and food.

Clinic 1: Using the Raspberry Pi Pico, A New Alternative To The Arduino Nano or LEDs and LDRs and NeoPixels, by Paul Wilfong.

Clinic 2: Got Rust? A Hands on Clinic for Rust Applications by Wayne Pierce.

**September, 2023:** Mike Komo's layout tour of his Santa Fe Railway Needles District N scale (1:160) model railroad layout.

**October, 2023**, we visited the North County Model Railroad Society and Swap Meet in Oceanside.

**November, 2023:** Fall Meet at the San Diego Model Railroad Museum located in Balboa Park. Events included Bingo for Trains, Show & Tell, food and two clinics. Layout tours were provided of the San Diego Model Railroad Society's O scale 2-rail layout and of the La Mesa Model Railroad Club.

Clinic 1: Bob Chaparro's Right Of Way & Trackside clinic.

Clinic 2: Ken Clark's Brass Clinic.

January, 2024: Jay Styron's HO Scale Model Railroad Layout Tour

February, 2024: Winter Meet at the S-Gaugers model railroad layout in La Mesa. Clinic 1: BlueRail Trains. David Rees, founder of BlueRail Trains (developers of the SoundTraxx Blunami and the Bachmann EZ App), gave the story of the development, capabilities and future of direct wireless train control and how it may apply to today's hobbyist.

Clinic 2: A DCC Steam Throttle. Kyle Jensen controls his steam locomotives using his custom built DCC & Sound Steam Throttle. The throttle is built to physically resemble an actual steam locomotive cab, including gauges, a throttle lever, a rope to ring the bell and more. Kyle presented the process and problems of building the throttle using a 3D printer. He also discussed his methodology in setting up the electronics for the throttle.

**April, 2024:** Wayne Pierce's On30 Model Railroad Layout Tour. Wayne's layout is a freelance version of a prototype railroad in the era of the 1950s to the 1970s, named the Minieton Railroad & Lumber Co. It depicts a portion of the he Minieton Railroad & Lumber Co. which purchased a section of one of the railroad lines, in 1952, from the Denver and Rio Grande Western Railroad (1870-1992). The Minieton Railroad continued railroad operations on this line into the 1970s. The railroad is highly detailed and indicates Wayne's expert artistic skills as a modeler.

Okay I get it. It can for some of the AP Certificates take a few days to find the information and fill out the forms. But compare that to the thousands of hours you most likely put in on building your layout that make a few days seem insignificant. And please do not over think what is actually needed. Here are some helpful hints.

For Volunteer, Official and Author all you need to do is keep track of the time you spent as an official, for author the pages of articles you have written and for volunteer the hours you spent doing clinics, working NMRA meets and conventions. I would bet a lot of you have earned at least one of these so just spend the time and fill out the paperwork.

If you have built a layout or some modules you most likely have meet the requirements needed for structures, scenery, civil, and electrical. Again, just keep track of what you have done. For structures and cars keep all the merit awards in a folder and you will be amazed how soon you will meet the requirements. The same goes for civil and electrical you most likely have drawn a track plan and that will work for both certificates along with a few other drawings and some track work. For scenery once completed just take some good photos and a very short write up on the techniques used to build the scenery. One page is all that is required.

So that leaves Dispatcher, Motive power and Prototype Models, like running trains in a prototype manner then dispatcher is just a matter of putting in the required time in four operations jobs. Yes, for motive power you need to scratch build a self-powered locomotive but it can be just a critter. Prototype modeler is just finding a photo of a scene you like that has the required elements in it and build an exact copy.

Remember this is not a test but just recognition for the fine model building you have done over all these years. Is becoming an MMR for everyone? NO, just like in the Boy Scouts not every scout will reach the rank of Eagle but you still can have tons of fun and just enjoy the hobby. Model railroading is meant to be fun and meet the needs you want it to fill.

#### PACIFIC SOUTHWEST REGION 37 TREASURERS FIRST QUARTER DIS-PATCH REPORT

#### **SUMMARY:**

During the period November 30, 2023, through March 22, 2024, there were several PSR financial transactions, both deposits and credits.

On the credit (expense) side, National Membership Rebates to the Divisions totaling \$857.00 were distributed, as well as a \$514.41 payment to InMotion hosting for 2 years of PSR region and division website, Domain and Backup services.

On the Deposit Side, only the NMRA National Membership Rebates (\$857) were deposited in this period.

The on-line Bank Statement indicates that the Region had \$21,851.28 on 3/21/2024.

Note that the PSR loaned \$10,000 in "seed money" to the 2024 Convention Committee, which remains outstanding.

**Call for Candidates** 

The Pacific Southwest Region (PSR), National Model Railroad Association (NMRA) has the following offices coming open for election:

#### PSR President PSR Vice President

Any member in good standing with the NMRA (or who is applying for such membership) and living within the boundaries of the Pacific Southwest Region consisting of the Four Divisions (Arizona (AZ), Cajon (CJ), Los Angeles (LA) & San Diego (SD)), may run for either office. Each elected candidate will assume office for a period of two (2) years, coinciding with PSR's Annual Membership Meeting in <u>August, 2024.</u>

#### Duties and responsibilities of each office as found in the bylaws of the PSR:

President and Vice President as Directors. In addition to the Division Directors in section 5.02(b), the President and Vice President shall be Directors of the board. The President and Vice President are elected by a majority the general membership of the Region casting a vote.

The PSR President as chief executive officer of the organization is charged with the conduct of all BOD meetings, the appointment of committees, the execution of all documents authorized by the Board of Directors, and the supervision of the general business of the organization.

The PSR Vice President shall assume the duties of the President in his/her absence and assist in carrying out the duties assigned to the President. In the event of death or resignation of the president, the Vice President shall issue the notice for a Board of Directors meeting for the purpose of filling the vacancy in accordance with Article V, Section 5.04(c) of the By-Laws and the provisions of this Manual under Vacancies in Office and assume the duties of the President until such a vacancy is filled.

The President and Vice President shall hold office for a term of two years. They may not serve for more than one (1) successive term.


